

DUAL ENROLLMENT 12: 2019-2020: COURSE OVERVIEW

This course is composed of a survey of British literature to meet the state requirement for 12th grade English along with 2 semesters of college English administered through Jefferson State Community College. The course requirements for the two college courses are:

ENG 101 English Composition I

3 semester hours

English Composition I provides instruction and practice in the writing of at least six (6) extended compositions and the development of analytical and critical reading skills and basic reference and documentation skills in the composition process.

ENG 102 English Composition II

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: A grade of "C" or higher in ENG 101. English Composition II provides instruction and practice in the writing of six (6) formal analytical essays, at least one of which is a research project using outside sources and/or references effectively and legally. Additionally, English Composition II provides instruction in the development of analytical and critical reading skills in the composition process.
