Course Description: Advanced English 8 is geared toward independent learners with above-average skills in reading and writing, considerable aptitude, scholastic motivation, and a strong work ethic. This course addresses all of the same standards as English 8 but is distinguished by its quickened pace, extensive workload, and required level of independence. Students are expected to maintain a high level of proficiency in reading, writing, grammar, and vocabulary.

Standards: Advanced English 8 uses the 8th-grade ELA <u>standards</u> from the <u>Mountain Brook Schools English Language Arts Curriculum Framework</u>, which were developed, approved, and adopted by the Mountain Brook Board of Education in the spring of 2022. My class novels can be found on the Mountain Brook Schools <u>Outside Reading List</u>.

Grading System: Each assignment is given a point value.

- **Assessments:** this includes (but is not limited to) tests, projects, essays, and quizzes. These are weighted more heavily than assignments.
- **Assignments:** this includes (but is not limited to) homework, class work, group work, projects, participation, and discussion. These are weighted less heavily than assessments.
- Note: all grades are tied to standards.

Grading Scale:

- 90 100 = A
- 80 89 = B
- 70 79 = C
- 65 69 = D
- 0 64 = F

Classwork / Homework: All work is to be submitted on time.

- Calendar: Please consult the calendar on Schoology for information about the month's assignments.
- Make-up Work:
 - O If you have an excused absence and miss an assignment, you have up to three days to turn in the completed assignment.
 - O If you know you are going to be absent and have made arrangements with the school, then your completed work is due upon your arrival back to school.
 - O If you are present on the day of the assignment's due date but absent for class, you must submit your work digitally. Failure to do so will result in being treated as late work and standard penalties will apply.
 - O If you are absent for the full day, you must email your assignment before the end of the school day and submit a hard copy upon your return to school.

• Missing Assignment:

O Marked as "MA" in the gradebook, which is a zero until it is turned in.

O When a student has two or more MAs, disciplinary measures will be taken to address the issue.

• Consequences for late work:

O Late work will result in consequences (homework room, point deduction, before or after school meeting with the teacher, etc.).

Academic Honesty: Every student is expected to adhere to the school policy and do his/her best work. Plagiarism and cheating are unacceptable in Spartan conduct. For more information about what constitutes academic dishonesty, consult the "Policy on Academic Dishonesty" handout.

Punctuality: Participation in class begins with the bell. Be on time and ready for class each day.

- What constitutes a tardy? Being late for class without a written excuse.
- Consequences for tardiness or other rule infractions: Warning, Parent Contact, Detention, Referral to Administration

Missing Materials: Students should bring the necessary materials to class. Not having materials constitutes a "tardy." If this becomes an issue that continues to affect instructional time, disciplinary measures will be taken.
